The School Sport Premium

The School Sport Premium was introduced in September 2013. It is funding allocated yearly to all maintained and state-funded schools with primary phase pupils. The main objective of this funding is to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of Physical Education, Sport and Physical activity (PESPA) that they offer.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding but we should use the premium to:

- Develop or add to the Physical Education, Sport and Physical activity that our school already offers
- Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvement made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

The Department for Education have identified 5 key indicators that we should expect to see improvement across. They are:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity;
- The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement;
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport;
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils;
- Increased participation in competitive sport.

This money presently equates to £16,000 per school per year plus an additional £10 per child in Years 1 to 6. For our school in 2024/25 this means a sum of £19,570 based on 357 Key Stage 1 pupils. This does not include our Reception children.

Please see details of how the Sports Premium Funding is being spent at our school within the plan below.

Key achievements from 2024-to date:

- Platinum Plus Quality Start Award for our PE provision
- Playground zones fully equipped and used to increase levels of activity and engagement at playtimes and opportunities provided for Active 60.
- Increase in girls' participation rates for Extra-Curricular clubs.
- Provided 3 Intra school competitions and festivals (Skipping Workshop, Circuits and Timed Run)
- Playleaders trained to provide and run playground games during Playtimes.
- Questionnaire sent out and analysed. CPD training arranged from this.
- CPD training provided by PE Coordinators and Real PE trainers.
- Real PE and Playtime training for TA's.
- Learning walks conducted by PE Coordinators, and feedback provided.
- Team Teaching and demonstration lessons provided by PE Coordinators to support less confident teachers.
- Increased participation in WSSA events for competitive participation
- Increased profile of PE and sport among staff and children with our new display board that is constantly updated. PE updates provided in the Newsletter and Medium Term Planner for Parents.
- Increased number of extra-curricular clubs
- High participation rates for Extra-Curricular Clubs across the school for all and Pupil Premium children.
- Organised our annual Alive and Kicking theme (off timetablehealthy living lessons/sports activities across the theme providing more active opportunities for all children.

Areas for further improvement during 2025-2026

- Establish a Change4 Life/Active Club to target various groups of children and parents to increase participation rates.
- Parent engagement/link to home using Active Bags.
- Questionnaire to gather feedback on staff confidence to provide next steps and training.
- Raise the profile of Play Leaders across the school.

- Purchased Sports Kits for children attending Festivals and Competitions.
- Successful, engaging and inspiring Sports Days for all year groups.
